This Month's Feature: An Outline/Flow Chart of The Alphabet That Changed the World



The Alphabet That Changed the World - An Outline





The Alphabet That Changed The World: Description of Graphic Outline

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Everything starts with the first letter of B'reshit, *Bet*. Bet tells us to make distinctions. (*Bet* = house. A house distinguishes inside from outside.)



ON THE RIGHT—Outside: Wheel of Karma; The Cycles of Life and Cosmos

The meanings of the names of the letters come from an understanding of the alphabet as forming three "embryological" cycles. These match the work of mathematical philosopher Arthur M. Young. The idea is that B'reshit 1:11 tells us to expect "a fruit tree yielding fruit whose seed is in itself." This is an *ouroboros*. The ouroboros cycles from seed to tree to fruit, to fruit with new seed—and the cycle starts over.

This produces a chart of functional or operational meanings for the twenty-seven letters.

ON THE LEFT—Inside: Consciousness; Free Will, inFORMation, Evolution

The shape of the letters comes from fashioning a model hand that embodies:

- 1) The proclamation of the Sh'ma: Hashem-Elokim = Echad (One)
- 2) The Golden Rule: As Above, So Below
- 3) Ps. 84:12: "Hashem-Elokim is a sun and a shield"



These three lead to the inverted-T diagram, with the vertical line representing the One, the Transcendent, and Hashem; and the horizontal line representing the All, the Immanent, and Elokim.

As the inverted-T shape in two dimensions is brought into higher dimensions, it transforms itself (via established mathematical principles) into the shape of the model hand (the tefillin strap) whose 2-D outlines generate the letter-shapes in gesture.

Yehuda HaLevi's "device" confirms this geometry:

"The shapes of the letters are not the result of accident, but of a device بُنْتُونُ which is in accord with the intention of each letter. . ."

The inner and outer streams of development converge on the gestures. The embryological development, the ouroboros, the fruit tree yielding fruit whose seed is in itself, generates the sequence of twenty-seven meanings; while the idealized model hand—when gestured—generates the shape of each letter.

The purpose of generating these gesture-letters is so as to be able to record physical and mental exercises, dances, and meditations. I speculate that when particular passages are gestured in unison by a loving minyan, new real properties can emerge. This process is comparable to the emergence of superconductivity from a Bose-Einstein condensate in physics.

Here is a description of the ideal minyan:

Before worshipping in the synagogue, an individual had to commit himself to the *mitsva* of loving one's fellow, so that all of the prayers of Israel would be combined together. *Especially important, writes Hayyim Vital, was "the love of companions who study Torah together; each of them must regard himself as though he were one part of the body of the group of his companions, especially if he has the knowledge and understanding to know his fellow's soul. . . . [sic] And my teacher cautioned me greatly about the need for love to prevail among the companions in our group." The source of this requirement for love in connection with prayer is the mystical conception of the <i>minyan* of ten worshippers in the synagogue as one body, symbolizing the *sefirot* or the bodily parts of the *Shekhina* . . . ⁱⁱ

The key to understanding this process is in the word for "assembly," *knesset*, which literally means "to hold miracles." (*Kaf*=hold; *Nes*=miracle; *Tav*=plural.)

All of this taken together implies that the Abrahamic traditions carry a true science of consciousness (in the modern sense) that is still active today. All we need do is recover the alphabet, and the exercises and experiences that come from it.
